Learning takes many forms

With all his success, DeLuca learned his most valuable lesson in a humbling failure with his own child.

Thirty-two years ago, DeLuca signed up his son, Charlie DeLuca III, to play in his first tournament at the Redland Golf & Country Club in Homestead. Just two holes into the event, little Charlie, only 7 then, flung his club to the turf in disgust, slammed his bag to the ground and ran fuming off the golf course.

"I had a rule in our junior program that parents couldn't be on the golf course during an event," DeLuca said. "As the executive director, I was allowed to be there, and I began following my son.

"It didn't take me long, and I was telling him that he wasn't lining up right, and that he should do this and should do that. I started doing everything I don't allow other parents to do. I was a typical father, and he ran off, all the way to the clubhouse. He wouldn't play golf for a couple years after that. I learned from that."

That the elder DeLuca learns as well as he teaches is evident in his son's success today. Charlie DeLuca III is following in his father's footsteps as a club professional with expertise in junior golf. He was named the South Florida PGA's Junior Leader of the Year in 2006.

The younger DeLuca is leading all four of the South Florida PGA-sanctioned free junior clinics in the section this summer.

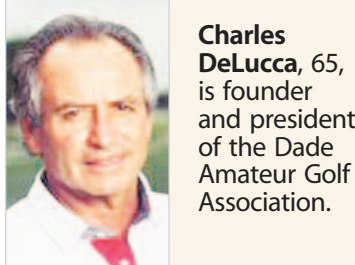
"I grew to see how amazing my dad is with juniors," said Charlie DeLuca III, 39.

What the father and son have learned together is that hooking a junior on golf is all about making the learning fun. Usually, that means disconnecting parental instincts.

"I think the best way to get them started is to take them with you to the driving range and let them watch you hit balls," the elder DeLuca said. "Don't push it on them, just see if it's something they want to try. You only need

one club for them in the beginning, just make sure it fits them.

"If they want to hit the ball, don't worry how they grip the club. If they grip it cross-handed, or with split hands, leave them alone. Just encourage them, praise them. If you start correcting them right away, they'll quit on you. That's the biggest problem we have with beginners."

"Let them find their own way in the beginning, and they'll develop

some habits, some good and some bad, but that's OK because they'll be ready for instruction."

What's the best age to start a child? Typically, age 6 is the youngest most camps accept, but "Age doesn't matter," says Dick Costello, the head professional at Boca Raton Municipal, who spent 27 years as golf professional and men's golf coach at the Cornell University Golf Course. "If they're old enough to show real interest, they're old enough to learn. An important part of that is showing the willingness to practice. I tell a parent, in no uncertain terms, I'm not a baby-sitting service. If I'm going to teach a child, I have to know a child's interested in practicing. A child's not going to have fun if he or she isn't getting better."

When a child shows consistent

interest in golf, the next step is fundamentally sound instruction.

That could come once a week in a junior clinic, or in a weekly summer camp, or in one-on-one instruction.

Most courses and driving ranges offer junior clinics or camps and lessons.

"Camps and clinics are good because kids like to be around other kids," said Dan McCarthy, director of instruction at Grande Oaks Golf Club in Davie, which offers free weekly summer clinics for Junior Golf Association of Broward members. "They're going to have fun together and they're going to play games, and they're going to learn while they're doing that."

Sutherland takes 2-stroke lead at AT&T

DULUTH, GA. • Kevin Sutherland shot a 7-under 65 in favorable scoring conditions Thursday to take a two-stroke lead after the first round of the AT&T Classic.

Japan's Ryuji Imada, a former standout at the University of Georgia, eagled his final hole to join Stephen Marino, Tommy Armour III, Bob May and Craig Kanada at 67 on the Greg Norman-designed TPC Sugarloaf course.

Sutherland's 8-iron shot hit the lip of the bunker on the par-3 16th and rolled into the sand, but the 42-year-old Californian, who began play on the back nine, holed the bunker shot for the first of three consecutive birdies. After hitting a wedge within 5 feet at No. 17, Sutherland reached the 18th green in two shots, leading to the second of his four birdies on the par 5.

"It kind of adds up fast when they come in bunches like that," Sutherland said. "It was a really just a solid day for me."

Imada, who finished in the top 15 of the U.S. Open the past two years, recovered from a double bogey at the par-4 fifth that left him 2 over. A few Georgia fans helped him stay loose with playful Bulldog barks from the gallery.

"After the double on 5, I knew I had to make birdies," Imada said. "But I knew there were three par 5s that were reachable, and once I got to six and made birdie, I started feeling better. My shots showed it."
